



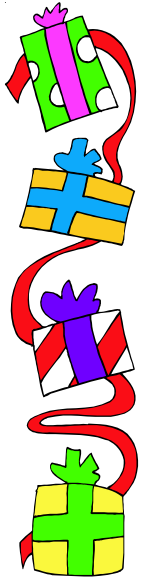

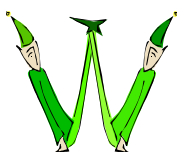

Phil Mann (Wi 1998-2007) emailed us this update:

It's my senior year here down in Fort Worth, Texas and it has been a surreal life. Not only am I a student, but I am also the Sports Director for our radio station KTCU. As you can see by the picture attached, I am getting ready to present "Horned Frog Countdown": a pregame show 2 hours before the TCU football game. My co-broadcaster and I hope to be there at the BCS Bowl in January rooting on our purple and white to crush the opposition. live". No word on whether we will be doing it or not, but hey, maybe you can even tune in weekdays at 5:00/4:00CT and hear daily newscasts that I present. I am News Director for our station as well. I covered it for the Associated Press, Sporting News Radio, and metro networks. I interviewed most of the Oakland Raiders, so my career in sports broadcasting is on the way up. "China is pretty incredible. Shanghai is pretty westernized but do a little digging and there are some pretty incredible things to see. I'm a working stiff so I don't get out of the city that much but I've been to Hong Kong a few times already and attached are some pictures from a trip to Huangshan, or Yellow Mountain. We got up early and watched the sun rise from one of the peaks, it was beautiful and brought back some good memories of a few morning masochist runs up pleasant. It was a little disappointing though because all the trails are cement walkways and steps, lots and lots of steps, (did I mention the steps?) and it's crowded. Literally hundreds of other people crawling all over the place, especially at trail junctions so its pretty loud and kinda detracts from the natural beauty. Despite all that it was nice to get some fresh air and have a clear sky overhead. They do practice carry in carry out but its the local workers who do all the carrying and the visitors are pretty careless with their waste. There are hostels and hotels on the mountain so there is a steady stream of chinese men carrying loads of vegetables, water, trash, dried goods and everything else up and down the mountain using shoulder poles. And if you're especially lazy you can hire two of them to carry you in a bamboo chair up and down and all around the mountain."
